

MAP OF YUCATAN.

Note. The outline of the Coast is taken from the English and Spanish charts, chiefly from the former, and is supposed to be accurate.

The dotted line—points out our route from Sisal, to our return to that Port, and is principally laid down from bearings, and distances, and of course only approximates to correctness.

The Latitudes of Merida and Izamal, are laid down from meridian altitudes of the Sun.

The Places engraved in outline letters, are taken from manuscript maps, and are probably very far from accurate, no survey of the country having ever been made and published.

A line—thus under the name of a Place signifies that there are ruins there.
